



SOCIETY OF SPONSORS OF THE UNITED STATES NAVY CENTENNIAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



The Society of Sponsors of the United States Navy is offering this scholarship in honor of Navy and Marine Corps Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation New Dawn Combat Wounded Veterans. Administered by the Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society (NMCRS), these scholarships are designated for combat wounded or injured veterans who have chosen to serve their country again by entering the teaching profession.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Be a combat wounded veteran of the Navy or Marine Corps injured during Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF), Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) or Operation New Dawn (OND)
- Pursuing a degree leading to licensure as a teacher.
- Be enrolled as a full-time student in an accredited college or university.
- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (on a scale of 4.0).

PROGRAM DETAILS:

- \$3,000 scholarship per academic year
- All awards are based on eligibility and review of the application.
- Applications may be submitted at anytime during the academic year.
- Receipt of a scholarship for one year does not guarantee an award for future years.
- Disbursements are made directly to the student by NMCRS on behalf of the Society of Sponsors of the United States Navy. Third party disbursements are not authorized.
- Academic year is defined as August through May.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Step 1. Complete and submit an application located at the end of these instructions.

Step 2. Submit an official copy of all transcripts.

- a. If the applicant will be a college freshman, we will need high school transcripts
- b. If the applicant is currently in a college/university send the official transcripts of all college credit courses.

Step 3. Include the supporting documents.

- a. Certificate of Release of Discharge from active duty DD 214

Step 4. Submit an essay. For more instructions see number 19 on the application.

Step 5. A Final Check:

- Application Completed—sent to NMCRS
- Official Transcripts requested from school to be sent to NMCRS
- Supporting documents included—DD 214
- Essay—attached to application
